All students at Sevenoaks have Trinity examinations classes in the morning (25 lessons per week).

Description & location

Sevenoaks School was founded in 1432 and is one of the oldest schools in England. It is situated in pleasant parkland, five minutes' walk from the lively, small town of Sevenoaks. Sevenoaks is only 30 minutes from central London by train (Charing Cross station). Brighton is one hour away by coach.


Facilities at the school are of the highest standard, including a multi-million pound centrally located dining hall and classroom complex opened in 2001, and an £8 million sports centre, opened in 2005. Sports facilities include:

- Multi-purpose sports hall for volleyball, basketball, 5-a-side football and badminton
- A 25-metre, 6-lane indoor heated swimming pool
- Dance and aerobics studio
- Three squash courts
- A climbing wall covering 265 square metres of wall space
- All-weather tennis courts
- Extensive games fields

Discos and talent shows are held in the multi-purpose Sackville Theatre. Thames Valley has access to the school's well equipped computer rooms for students to send/receive emails and access social networking sites.


One special feature of the campus is the beautiful landscaped gardens, which are at their most attractive in the summer. In total the campus is 40 hectares.

Contact details

Students will be accommodated in the above boarding houses, and will be told to phone home as soon as possible after arrival to notify their parents which house they are in. We know that most students bring their own mobile phones, but telephone numbers in boarding houses are listed above should parents wish to use them.

To reduce disruption, we recommend that students telephone their parents rather than vice versa. Except in an emergency, students are not permitted to use their mobiles during classes and when participating in organised activities. If parents need to phone their son/daughter, the best times to call are 13.30 - 14.15, 17.00 - 18.00 UK time.

Bedrooms

Students are accommodated in single or twin bed rooms and mini-dormitories with 3-6 beds. Up to four boarding houses are used by Thames Valley, depending on student numbers, with 25-55 students in each.

Girls International and Sennocke are five minutes' walk away from the school's main buildings. School House and International Centre are 10 minutes' walk away.

Sheets and duvet covers are provided by the school and changed once a week and on student changeover days. Personal laundry is provided twice per week and returned within 48 hours.

Bedrooms are cleaned daily except at weekends, when only the common areas are cleaned. Showers/baths are available to students on the ratio of 1:3 to 1:5, depending on the boarding house.
