Description & location

St John's School is co-educational with 625 pupils aged 13-18. Founded in 1851, its main cloistered buildings form a quadrangle around beautifully manicured lawns, giving it the feel of a traditional Oxbridge college.

The school is located 5-minutes' walk from Leatherhead town centre, which is 30 km from central London. There are frequent trains to the capital (Victoria and Waterloo stations) with a journey time of 45 minutes. Heathrow and Gatwick airports are both less than 35 km away. Brighton and the south coast is less than an hour by road.

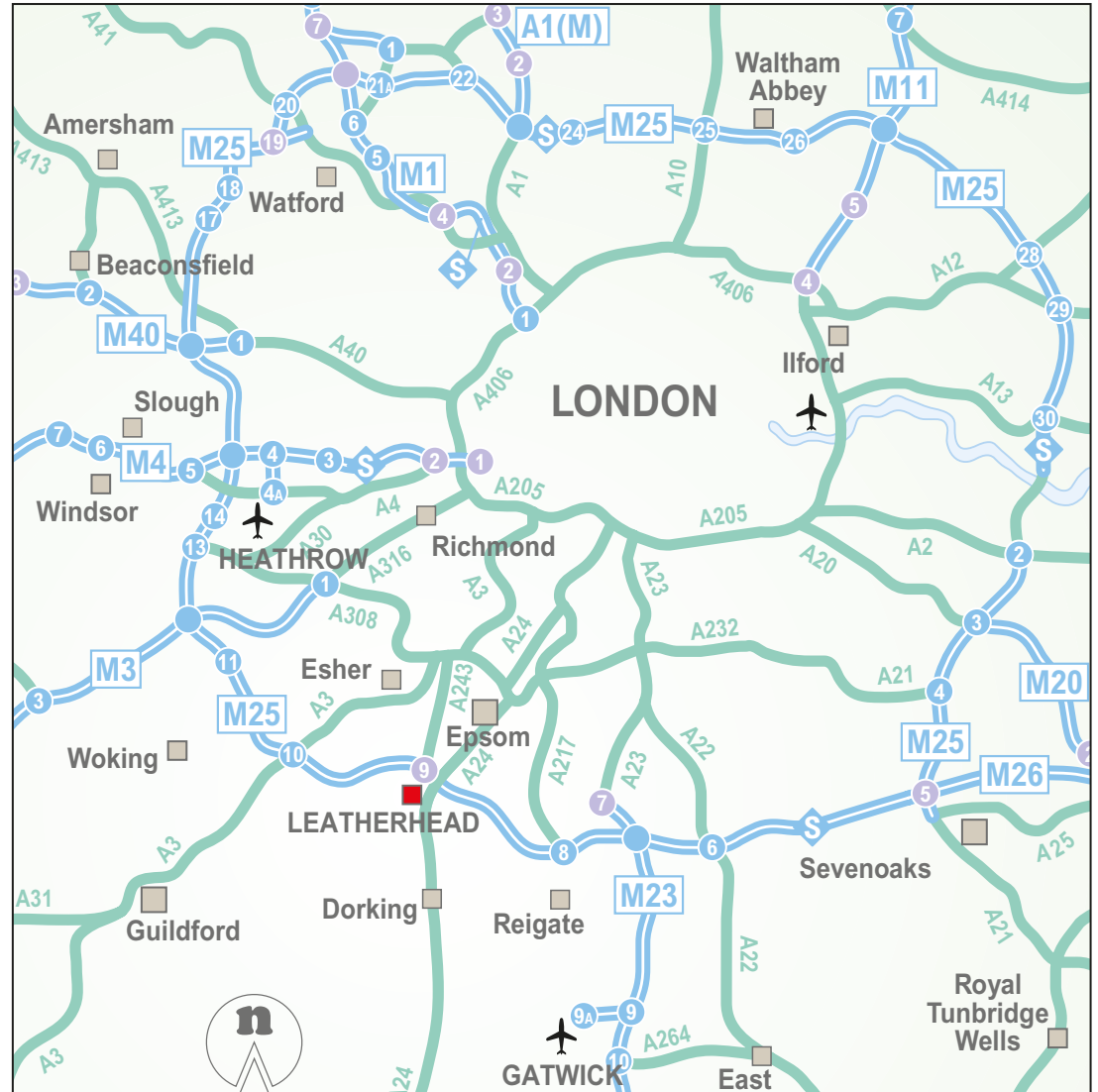
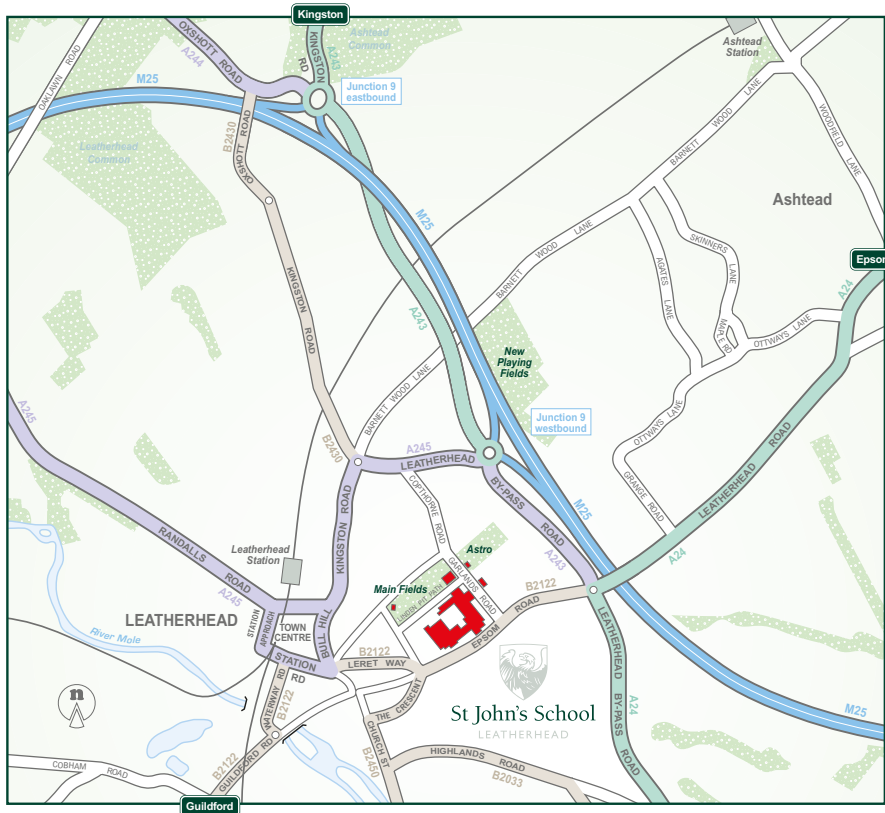
Classes are held in the Henry Dawes Centre, a multi-million pound teaching complex, opened in 2010. Its first class facilities include 19 classrooms, three computer suites with 68 workstations and specialist facilities for art and design.

Sports facilities comprise:

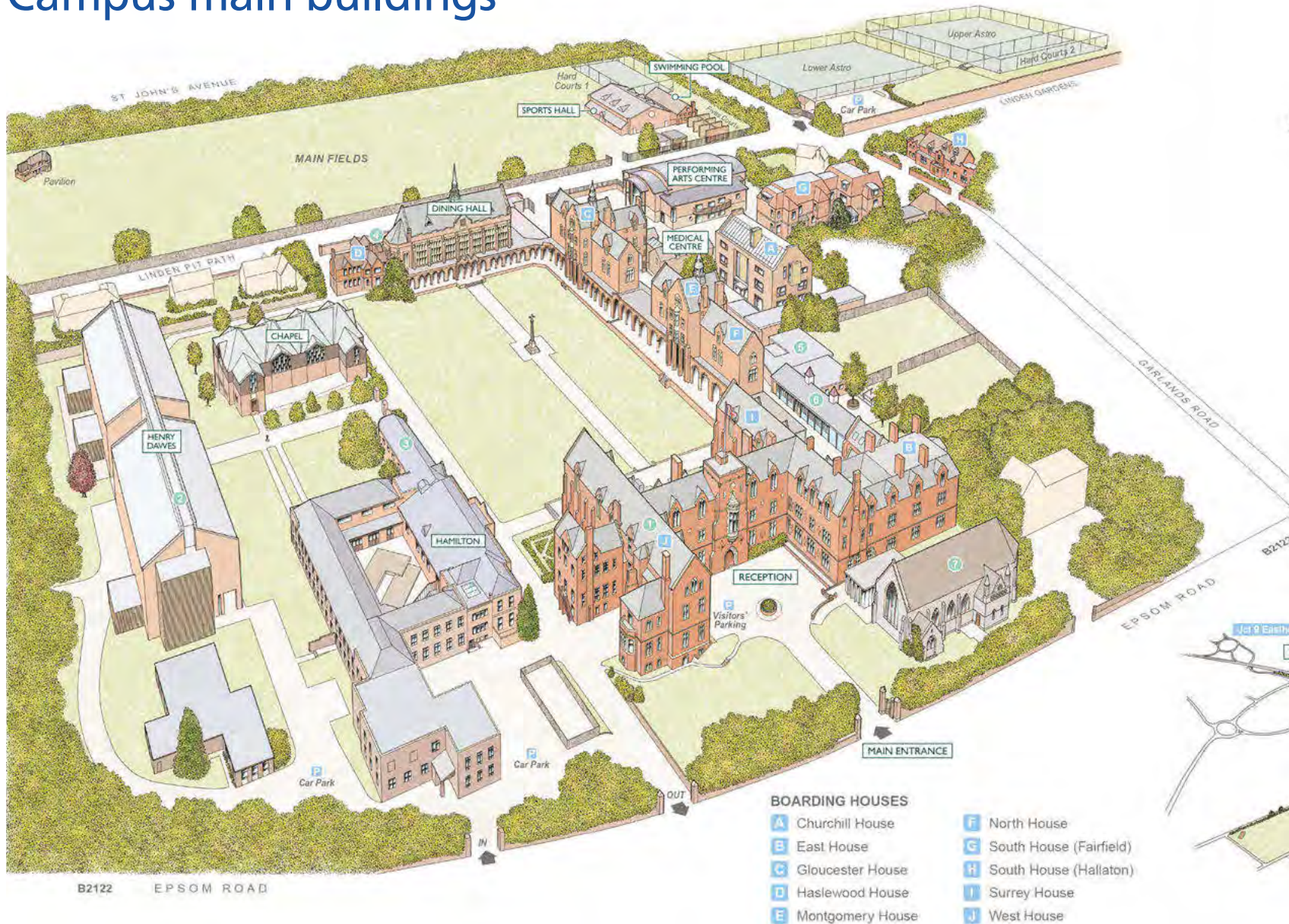
- Multi-purpose sports hall for basketball, volleyball and 5-a-side football

Contact details

Students will be told to phone home as soon as possible to notify their parents which house they are in. We know that most students bring their own mobile phones, but telephone numbers in boarding houses are listed above should parents wish to use them.

To reduce disruption, we recommend that students telephone their parents rather than vice versa. Except in an emergency, students are not permitted to use their mobiles during classes and when participating in organised activities. If parents need to phone their son/daughter, the best times to call are 13.30 - 14.00, 17.00 - 18.00 UK time.

Bedrooms

The majority of students are accommodated in single or twin bed rooms and mini-dormitories with 3–6 beds. Up to three boarding houses are used by us, depending on student numbers with 20–50 students in each. All boarding houses are located close to each other and the school's main buildings. All have attractive common rooms with TV/DVD. Sheets and duvet covers are provided by the school and changed once a week and on student changeover days. Personal laundry is provided once per week and returned within 48 hours.

Bedrooms are cleaned daily except at weekends, when only the common areas are cleaned. Showers/baths are available to students on the ratio of 1:3 to 1:5, depending on boarding house.

Our Tech Academy offers a choice of three courses, led by instructors from the UK's premier technology education provider, FireTech Camp. These courses are designed to get young people creating and innovating using computer technology. There will be an end of course certificate stating skills learnt.

Robotics

- Students learn to design, build and program robots.
- They master VEX IQ robotics challenges while learning to code in the C-based programming language ROBOTC.
- They work their way through a series of challenges and tournaments to hone their skills and try to beat their opponents!

Mobile Apps
